# 1. Introduction

This toolkit has been developed to help you support the National Careers Service Exam Results Helpline campaign 2020.

Our overall objective is to get young people to access available support for their exam results or next steps. There are 4 main ways young people can access support:

- Calling a careers adviser
- Using webchat to talk to a careers adviser
- Searching for the National Careers Service on social media
- Visiting the new 16+ and 18+ explainer content on our website

Key influencers in young people's lives, such as parents, careers leaders and teachers, may also benefit from the support available when helping them to make decisions.

We've created a selection of assets for you to use and ask that you share the content we post through the national account at both @NationalCareers and @exam\_helpline.

Whilst we appreciate this year is different in terms of exam results, we know young people will still need support and we hope you can help us make them aware of our offer.

# **Key points**

- The Exam Results Helpline delivered by the National Careers Service will be available in August to provide additional support to students (and their parents) as they receive their exam results.
- Whether they're finishing GCSEs or A levels, support is available about what options young people have. There are options for full-time education, getting a job, combining work and study and even for volunteering. Other support will be available on topics such as clearing, university, gap years, moving away from home and re-sits.

- The helpline and webchat will be available from 8am to 10pm, 7 days a week, calls are free from landlines and most mobile numbers.

We know that this year is different for those receiving exam results, so the National Careers Service's Exam Results Helpline is available to help young people (and their parents/ carers) that are receiving results in August. The helpline has professional careers advisers available to provide free, impartial advice and guidance on the different choices available which includes:

- Skills, qualifications and subject choices
- Re-sits and re-marks
- Post-16 and Post-18 options, including gap years and re-sits/re-marks
- Moving away from home
- Vocational learning routes including diplomas, apprenticeships, SVQs and NVQs
- Careers, employment and setting up in business

You can speak to a dedicated careers adviser by calling our helpline on 0800 100 900 or using webchat any day between 8am -10pm from the 12<sup>th</sup> August – 28<sup>th</sup> August. Or you can visit our website to research and compare your options for the future.
